The 8 week program from June 7 to July 30 is geared specifically for High School juniors and mature sophomores who are considering careers in science. The application deadline is April 1.

Applications from all students are welcome. Students whose families meet the listed financial criteria are eligible to receive a stipend of \$2,800 for their participation. Returning students are eligible to receive \$3,300. Additional internship opportunities are available for those who wish to participate as volunteers. Traditionally these volunteers receive a transportation stipend.

Project SEED was established by the American Chemical Society and is administered locally through the Indiana Section of the ACS in partnership with the IU School of Medicine and IUPUI. The Indianapolis SEED program has served 500 students and is proud of their success.

Students from the 2009 summer program were 1st place award winners at several scientific research poster competitions, including those held at the Biotechnology Conference and the IU School of Medicine. The program is also honored to have a Regional Finalist in both the Siemens and Intel competitions. Many of these students have already received acceptances and interviews at several prestigious universities, along with substantial scholarship awards.
